Summer Harvest Spotlight: Anna Apples



Introducing the Anna apple, a tangy summer treat first introduced in 1959. With skin that is 50% greenish-yellow, much like the Golden Delicious, many of our members are now harvesting them by the bucket loads.

It's Anna Apple season. Here are a bunch of recipes to support the bountiful harvest. Beyond the apple pie, try these delicious options: Cinnamon Apples, Apple Jalapeno Spread,, Apple Cobbler, Apple Smoothie, Apple Fennel Salad. For the spice lovers, check out this Green Apple Pickle, and for hot sauce enthusiasts, try the Fermented Green Apple Hot Sauce.

Be sure to harvest them before they turn blood red to avoid the cottony, mushy texture. You'll be pleased with the crisp and tangy results!

History: The Anna apple was bred by Abba Stein at the Ein Shemer kibbutz in Israel. It was created to be a Golden Delicious-like apple that can thrive in nearly tropical areas with very few chill hours. Enjoy your Anna apple harvest!


